### **Summit Fire Department Issues Information on Generator Safety**

SUMMIT, N.J., August 5, 2020 – The City of Summit Fire Department is issuing information on how to use generators safely during power outages. The department recently received a number of emergency calls related to dangerous levels of carbon monoxide in homes from generator use.

The Summit Fire Department asks citizens to employ the following safety tips when using a generator:

- Never use a generator inside a home, garage, crawl space, or other enclosed areas. Fatal carbon monoxide fumes can build up that neither a fan nor open doors and windows can properly ventilate.
- Professionally installed stationary home generators produce carbon monoxide and can cause carbon monoxide to enter the home. Ensure openings near a generator are sealed shut.
- Always use a generator outdoors in a location away from open windows, vents, or doors.
- Always have a working carbon monoxide detector in your home. Check to ensure it is in proper working order, especially when running a generator.
- Use extension cords that are grounded and rated for generator use. Coiled cords can get extremely hot; always uncoil cords and lay flat in open locations.
- Never plug a generator directly into a home outlet. If connecting a generator into a home electrical system, have a qualified electrician install a power transfer switch.
- Take precautions to protect your generator from exposure to rain and snow, and never operate under wet conditions.
