Determine next steps for emergency communications unknown at time of reorganization meeting



## Improve pedestrian and vehicle safety

Flashing beacons installed Ashwood Ave/Baltusrol Rd and Briant Pkwy/Orchard St. More locations coming soon including Springfield Ave/Pine Grove and Ashwood/Pearl/Michigan.

One-way trial ongoing on Briant Pkwy 

Prospect St sidewalks to begin soon, Hobart project to begin soon, and \$1M grant received for Canoe Brook Pkwy. Projects to improve Pine Grove, Butler Pkwy, West End Ave, Beacon Rd, Park Ave, Tulip St are complete so is micropaving of a dozen streets. Full project list is available on city website.

No viable path to redevelopment agreement

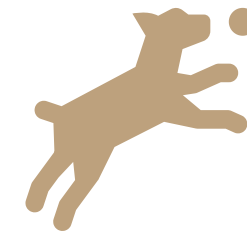


**Repeal of BSW Redevelopment Plan being introduced tonight to restore previous Zoning**

Mabie Playground investment in Capital Budget - emphasis on accessibility
