Preview of April 19 Common Council meeting agenda by Council President Marjorie Fox

The next Common Council meeting will be held on Tuesday, April 19 at 7:30 PM in Council Chamber at City Hall. Masks are now optional in City Hall.

There will be two presentations. The first presentation to recognize the Summit Police Department accreditation will be given by Harry Delgado, Accreditation Program Director, New Jersey State Association of Chiefs of Police. The second presentation will be by the Summit Lacrosse 50th Committee about a proposal for a lacrosse wall and gazebo at the Tatlock Sports Complex.

Council will introduce a single ordinance to allow for the temporary closure of Maple Street as a pedestrian mall. The public hearing will be on May 3, 2022.

Council will hear two Finance Committee resolutions.

- The first resolution is to concur with the 2022 Board of School Estimate Certification of Required Funds for school operations.
- The second resolution authorizes emergency temporary appropriations to the 2022 municipal budget in the amount of \$23,000. This resolution is needed to meet expenses that must be paid prior to the final adoption of the 2022 budget.

Council will consider nine Capital Projects and Community Services Committee resolutions.

- Those resolutions will: (1) authorize Arbor Day festivities; (2) authorize an agreement with NJDOT guiderail installation at the intersection of Hobart Avenue and Route 124; (3) award a bid for spring 2022 tree planting and watering of 125 trees in the city's right of way; and (4) award a bid for a cul-de-sac improvement project to repair sidewalks and curbs, improve drainage, and milling and paving on Meadowbrook Court, Crest Acre Court, Carleen Court, and Woodcroft Road.
- Again, this year, council will vote on resolutions to authorize temporary parklet locations. There are three resolutions for temporary parklets for The Office Tavern and Grill, Piattino, and DUE 360. The resolutions for The Office Tavern and Grill and Piattino also include authorization to execute a license agreement for the sale of liquor in the parklets.
- Another resolution will permit Home Power Yoga to use the Maple Street road closure for classes on weekend mornings.
- Finally, council will vote on a resolution to authorize a request by the city for an agreement with Union County for a permanent dog park at the Transfer Station.

The Law and Labor committee will introduce four resolutions. One authorizes a lease/license agreement for use of the sidewalk in front of the UPS store at 55 Union Place for outdoor dining by The Office Tavern and Grill. Another grants a place-to-place liquor license transfer for 490 Morris Avenue. A third resolution grants accrued time payout for a fire department employee. The last resolution appoints two residents to serve on the Rent Commission.
